

Beginners' Lesson 8: Takeout Double

East has a perfect takeout double - showing support for all unbid suits. West has a poor hand so bids hearts at the lowest possible level.

Lead is ♠ A against a heart contract or ♥ A (partner's contract) against a spade contract.

Play the hand twice: once in 2♥ by West then in 2♠ by North.

Declarer should draw trumps first. They make 9 tricks by losing ♥ A, ♠ A, ♦ AK.

South has an opening hand and tolerance for the unbid suits. North is strong enough to make a free bid, but not strong enough to bid game. North can bid 2♣ or 1NT to show they have values. EW can now bid diamonds to show at least 5 hearts and 4 diamonds.

Lead is ♠ 9 (top of partner's suit) against clubs and ♣ 4 against a heart contract.

Lead is ♠ 7.

Firstly, Declarer should play on clubs and later take a heart finesse.

Lead is ♣ 3 and North plays the King.

Declarer should win ♣ A and play the ♣ J to set up the ♣ 10 for the 9th trick.

Play the hand twice in spades and hearts. Both contracts should make 9 tricks.

Lead is ♥ K against spades and ♠ 2 against a heart contract.

Lead is ♦ Q top of a broken sequence.

Declarer draws trumps should play West, the opener, for the ♣ Q.

Therefore play the ♣ K then ♣ 10 and let it run if West does not cover with the Q♣

North's double promises support for all the unbid suits and an opening hand. Whilst South only has 6 HCP, they can make a 1-level bid, as partner probably has 4 hearts.

With 2 of partner's suit, West leads the top.

South should draw 3 rounds of trumps and set up spades remembering to play ♠ K first, to avoid being blocked.
